



ROBINS CITY COUNCIL
Minutes of the April 16th, 2018 Meeting

Mayor Hinz called the meeting to order at 5:30 p.m. in the Robins City Hall on Monday, April 16th, 2018. After the Pledge of Allegiance to the Flag, roll call was taken with Councilors Don Norton, Roger Overbeck, Brad Sevcik, Dick Pilcher and Marilyn Cook present along with Mayor Hinz, Attorney Kara Bullerman, Planning and Zoning Administrator Dean Helander, Public Works Superintendent Vince Bading, Police Captain Gary Manhart, City Clerk/Treasurer Lori Pickart and two guests.

Norton moved to approve the agenda, Sevcik seconded and all voted aye. There were no Citizen Comments.

OLD BUSINESS

- a. Cook moved to approve the Second Reading of Ordinance No. 1802, An Ordinance amending the Future Land Use Map by changing lot one of the Barnhart 2nd Addition from Residential to Commercial and amending the Robins Zoning Map by changing Lot 1 of the Barnhart 2nd Addition and Parcel B, Plat of Survey No. 211 from Agricultural to C-2 Highway Commercial. Overbeck seconded the motion and all voted aye. Norton moved to suspend the rules and place the Ordinance on its Third Reading by title only; Sevcik seconded the motion, on the vote Norton, Sevcik and Overbeck ayes; Cook and Pilcher nays. The motion failed.
- b. Pilcher moved to place Ordinance No. 1803 relating to parking on private property on its Second Reading, Overbeck seconded. Overbeck voiced his concerns relating to putting the city in jeopardy as it appears the property owner is already having vehicles towed without going through the procedures and wondered if we really need this Ordinance. Attorney Bullerman noted she is surprised someone would tow vehicles without going through the notification process as it is required by state code. Captain Manhart reassured the council this is a good ordinance for the city to have. He noted it is there to get rid of abandoned vehicles. On the vote, all voted aye. Overbeck moved to suspend the rules and place the ordinance on its Third Reading, Pilcher seconded. On the vote all voted aye. Sevcik moved to pass Ordinance 1803 on its Third Reading, Norton seconded, and all ayes.

NEW BUSINESS

- a. Mayor Hinz provided information relating to what other cities have done relating to fireworks. He noted he would like the Council to think about what they feel Robins should do and be prepared to discuss at the May 7th meeting.

The council then listened to the presentation given by Bill Micheel, Manager of the Corridor MPO relating to the Feasibility Study for a Regional Transit Authority. Mr. Micheel noted this is just Phase 1 of three phases, adding he is trying to get feedback from the Metro Area City Councilors, noting this may or may not go to a further phase.

Sevcik moved to adjourn at 6:53, Overbeck seconded and all voted aye.
